Introduction: Corinth is a troubled church with many problems.

- 1. In these opening chapters, Paul is focused on division.
- 2. As he closes this section, he takes the role of a loving father disciplining his children.
- 3. Discipline is not a pleasant subject, but it is very much needed in all of our lives.
- 4. As we analyze Paul's approach we can benefit on two levels.
  - We may see ourselves in the Corinthian delusion.
  - We may learn a better way to administer discipline.
- 5. We start our study by focusing on the Corinthians' delusion.
- I. The Corinthians' Delusion
  - A. Non-scriptural Lives
  - B. Imaginary Status
- II. The Corinthians' Correction
  - A. A Dose Of Reality
  - B. Genuine Love

Conclusion: There is a difference between punishment and discipline.

- 1. Punishment is punitive, whereas discipline is corrective.
- 2. In this text Paul confronts the delusion infecting Corinth.
- 3. But then he places the truth before them, so they could make the necessary changes.
- 4. We can all learn from Paul's example.
- 5. And perhaps we needed to hear the same message.
- 6. If you see yourself in the Corinthian delusion:
  - Surrender your pride.
  - Accept the humility of servanthood.
  - Allow God to use you!
