Introduction: As we work our way through 1 Corinthians, Paul is dealing with questionable things.

- 1. Last week the focus was on living a love your neighbor kind of life.
- 2. Here in chapter 9, he builds on that by focusing on how we should exercise our liberty in Christ.
- 3. Remember back in 1 Corinthians 6:12 we learned all things were lawful, but that doesn't mean they are profitable.
- 4. It may be wise to exercise our liberty by refraining for a greater good.
- 5. This is where Paul uses himself as an example.
- 6. As a servant of Christ, he had liberty, but he exercised it in a way that demonstrated his love for God and neighbor as well as his dedication to the ministry God had given him.
- 7. Our goal today is to allow Paul to teach us to be better servants of Christ.

- 1. Christianity calls us to a life of servanthood.

- 4. You belong to Him and should present yourself to Him as a "living sacrifice."
- 5. Our culture would see that as bondage, but in reality, it's freeing.
- 6. Our culture would see that as miserable, when in reality it leads to life to its very full.
- 7. Remember, if we save life for ourselves ... we lose it, but if we lose life for Christ, we find it!
