Introduction: In 1 Corinthians 12-14, Paul is focused on the role of spiritual gifts in the functioning of the church.

- Chapter 12 explained the "body" concept.
- Chapter 13 focused on love.
- 1. As we come to chapter 14, he begins to deal with the specific problems Corinth was experiencing.
- 2. The reality was the gifts were being abused
- 3. Paul is writing to correct this; he wants them to understand and desire the greater gifts.
- 4. One of the most troublesome areas was the use of tongues in the worship service.
- 5. As Paul confronts this error, we see two important goals for worship.
- I. Edification (Spiritual Growth)
 - A. Some Gifts Are Less Edifying
 - The Nature Of Tongues
 - The Effect Of Tongues
 - B. Other Gifts Are More Edifying
 - The Nature Of Prophecy
 - The Effect Of Prophecy

- II. Clarity (Understanding Truth)
 - A. Clarity Is Needed
 - For Words To Be Helpful
 - To Communicate Effectively
 - B. Clarity Achieved
 - Interpretation
 - Instruction

Conclusion: It is easy to get tangled up in the issue of tongues and miss what Paul is saying.

- 1. When the church gathers for worship, there is a clear purpose.
- 2. Truth should be communicated clearly so the Holy Spirit can build up the body of Christ.
- 3. Because that is true, Paul emphasized the use of prophecy over tongues.
