Introduction: Today we are continuing our study entitled "Ordinary People ... Extraordinary God."

- 1. So far, we have considered:
 - The 12 Apostles
 - Aquila and Priscilla
 - Ananias and Barnabas
- 2. Today we consider Timothy and how he exemplifies what it means to be a living sacrifice.
- 3. Paul introduced this term in Romans 12:1, but the concept was always a part of the gospel.
- 4. Jesus taught us to deny ourselves, take up our cross and follow Him.
- 5. He cautioned us, should we save our lives for ourselves, we'd lose it. But if we lose our lives for Christ's sake, we will find it.
- 6. In Timothy, an ordinary person, we see God doing extraordinary things because Timothy became a living sacrifice.
- 7. As we consider his spiritual journey, we can better learn what that means.

- 1. What we do have is a record of his life from when he met Paul till he replaced Paul.
 - This was a span of some 18 years.
 - They were not easy years.
- 2. How did he navigate the stressors he faced to become the Timohty who replaced Paul?
- 3. He presented himself to God as a living sacrifice, renewed that commitment each day, denied himself, took up his cross, and followed God.
