 - He met Paul, became a Christian and immediately faced a moral dilemma.
 - His Christian duty would require him to return to his master and make restitution.
 - Death was the normal punishment for this offense.
- 3. See what I mean, this is an unusual story.
- 4. It's also an important story because as it unfolds, we see Christianity in action and the providence of God.

 - We'll see victory in Jesus.
