Introduction: As we return to our study of John's gospel, we come to a very familiar story.

1. By this time, Jesus is a marked man, and this is especially true in Jerusalem.
2. The leaders of Judaism see Jesus as an imposter leading the people astray.
3. They are conspiring to kill Him, but because of His popularity that option is risky. They realize they must undercut that popularity.
4. In this narrative we see a failed attempt, but we also see grace in action.
5. Grace is one of the most important aspects of our faith.
6. As we see Jesus operating in grace, we can learn to do the same.
